### **Editing for Conventions**

The grammar and punctuation are correct, and the copy is free of spelling errors.

- 1. Has the writer punctuated dialogue correctly?
- 2. Has the writer used pronouns correctly?

## **Editing Checklist**

#### **Punctuation**

- 1. Does the writer use end punctuation after all the sentences?
- 2. Does the writer use commas after longer introductory word groups?
- 3. Does the writer use commas correctly in compound and complex sentences?
- 4. Does the writer punctuate all dialogue correctly?
- 5. Does the writer use apostrophes to show possession?

#### Capitalization

- 6. Does the writer start all the sentences with capital letters?
- 7. Does the writer capitalize all proper nouns?

#### Spelling

- 8. Has the writer spelled all words correctly?
- 9. Has the writer double checked the words the spell checker may have missed?

#### **Grammar**

- 10. Does the writer use correct forms of verbs (had gone, not had went)?
- 11. Do the pronouns agree with their antecedents?
- 12. Does the writer use the right words (to, too, two; their, there, they're)?
