Writing a Personal Essay

Use the texts we've read together in class to help guide your style of writing.

Your first task is to choose an event from your own experience to write about. This creative, nonfiction personal narrative essay can be about anything as long as:

- 1. It is nonfiction and factually accurate
- 2. It is told in first-person
- 3. There is a main idea of the story
- 4. It is approved by Mrs. Scaggs

Your personal narrative should be 2-3 pages in length and should be in accordance with the Personal Narrative Rubric. You must remember to include the requirements listed below.

REQUIREMENTS

- 2-3 pages in length, 12-point Times New Roman font, double spaced, proper MLA heading
- Clever <u>title</u>
- Makes use of a solid **<u>attention-getter</u>**
- Thesis statement is clearly stated
- Obviously contains a clear **main idea** and all elements of the story relate to this main idea
- Clearly **organized**, containing introductory, body, and conclusion paragraphs that tie the essay together
- Action and details in the story contain vivid *imagery*
- Uses appropriate verb tense
- Consistent **point of view**
- Uses transitions to improve sentence fluency
- <u>SHOWS</u> story, doesn't <u>TELL</u> story!
