Peer Editing Checklist – Narrative Short Story

- 1. Does the TITLE of the story grab your attention? Is it interesting?
- 2. What does the writer talk about in the BEGINNING of the story?
- 3. Does the writer HOOK the reader within the first 3 sentences of the story?
- 4. What is the CONFLICT in the story?
- 5. What does the writer talk about in the MIDDLE of the story to build suspense and advance the plot?
- 6. Does the writer incorporate suspenseful details in the middle of the story?
- 7. Are the details of the story interesting?
- 8. How does the writer END the story?
- 9. What is the THEME of the narrative? Does the writer address the THEME of the narrative in the conclusion?
- 10. Does the dialogue in the story make sense, advance the plot of the story, and develop characters?
- 11. Does the narrative use 5 vocabulary words? Which words? Check to be sure they are listed in the vocabulary workbook.
- 12. Does the narrative use 2 cases of figurative language (other than simile or metaphor)? Do they work? Or do they seem contrived?
- 13. Does the word choice SHOW instead of TELL the story? Can you visualize what's happening in the story?
- 14. Does the story make sense? What should the writer do to improve this story?
